Prep / Foundation

Unit Topic:

What's My Story?



Big Understandings:

- What is family?
- My family demographics i.e. The roles of family members, where were they born and raised.
- Family structures can differ.
- My Personal History and how do I know? Past, present and future.
- Families have special events that they celebrate.



Literacy Focus:

This term the students will continue to explore the main sounds of the alphabet with an intense focus on formation of letters. They will begin working in their Literacy Groups where they will continue to develop their phonological knowledge. The students will focus on blending sounds together to form words, recognising common words and composing simple sentences.

During Writing sessions, the students will explore sequencing a familiar story, continue to focus on using spaces between their words and begin to add detail to their sentences. Students will begin bringing home decodable readers



that are full of sound friendly words students can sound out and blend together.

Art:

In Term 2 the students in Foundation will explore colour and shape, using a variety of mediums, as well as develop their mark making repertoire using paint and pastels.

Music Focus:

In Term 2, the Foundation students will continue their exploration of the musical elements with a focus on pitch, tempo and dynamics. They will have the opportunity to use a variety of tuned and untuned instruments to compose and perform rhythm patterns and will practise and perform simple dance routines.

Physical Education Focus:

During Term 2, students will participate in a Perceptual Motor Program. The program will incorporate gross motor skills such as jumping and skipping, visual motor skills such as eye-hand coordination (striking) and auditory motor skills such as responding to directions.





Digital Technologies

In Foundation Digitech, students will engage in activities designed to enhance their hand-eye coordination and mouse control. They will continue to use games and programs, which focus on practicing left and right clicking, click and drag, as well as familiarising themselves with the keyboard. This term, students will be introduced to the programs Paint and Purple Mash, where they will use the drawing tools to experiment with different lines, shapes, patterns and colours. Students will then create a book in 2Create a Story, consolidating their newly developed skills as well as inserting sounds, drawing images and typing sentences.


During Term 2, students will be introduced to vocabulary for animals found at a farm and those considered as pets. They will continue to revise and build on their knowledge of colours and numbers. This term, the students will continue working in their Literacy Groups with a focus on extending their phonological knowledge, applying this knowledge to multisyllabic words, and learning different reading skills to develop their comprehension, accuracy and fluency. They will read weekly texts and complete comprehension tasks and writing tasks directly related to these texts. In Writing, Year 1 students will focus on making excellent word choices, ensuring their sentences are fluent and they are conforming to sentence conventions. Year 2- In Writing, they will focus on word choice, sentence fluency, conventions and the presentation of their writing. This will lend itself across the writing genres.

Science Focus:

Year 1 – Push and Pull Year 2 - Weather

Art Focus:

Year 1 and 2 students will explore and experience using different tools to make a variety of textures with paint on paper. They will consolidate their cutting and pasting skills by using the paper they have made to make a collage.

Music Focus:

In Term 2, Year 1 and Year 3 students will continue to consolidate their knowledge of musical elements, with a focus on rhythm, melody and pitch. They will use the xylophone and a variety of untuned percussion instruments to develop their understanding of rhythmic patterns and notation. Singing and dancing will also be used as a way to explore pitch and movement.

Physical Education Focus:

During Term 2, students will focus on developing the fundamental motor skills of catching, ball bouncing and striking. The Year 1 and Year 2 Swimming Program will be held at AquaLink Nunawading from Monday 19th May to Friday 23rd May.

Digitech:

The Year 1 students will continue to use a Digital Lego Program to create patterns and present data creatively using simple graphs. They will also use Purple Mash to complete projects and share these safely with classmates. Students will revise skills such as saving work, mouse skills and typing. We will revise the 'THINK' acronym to ensure students feel confident and safe when using the Internet.

The Year 2 students will use an algorithm to design and create a multiple-choice game using the platform Purple Mash. They will be practicing the skills of copy and pasting, inserting photos, using the drawing tools, adding sounds as well as voice recordings to their game. They will begin each Digi Tech lesson practising their touchtyping skills using the program typing.com, building invaluable muscle memory learning to type the right way, through proper finger placement, at their own pace. Students will develop their programming and computational thinking skills using the self-paced website Code.org to progress through Course C. They will use characters to develop sequential algorithms to stack code blocks together in a linear sequence, moving them in a variety of directions. Students will develop programming and debugging skills on a computer platform.

Indonesian

During Term 2, students will learn different greetings and how to introduce themselves. They will be taught vocabulary relating to their family and will continue to revise their knowledge of colours and

Year 3 and Year 4

Unit Topics:

- How and why do people choose to remember significant events of the past?

Literacy Focus:

Year 3: This term students will be focusing on using tense correctly, adding correct punctuation into their writing and adding effective adverbs and adjectives. Speaking and Listening tasks will focus on planning engaging talks and speaking in front of an audience with confidence. In Writing, students will be focusing on using the 6+1 traits to enhance their writing pieces. This will be weaved in with Information reports in preparation for our Expo at the end of the term.

Year 4: The students will be focussing on determining the main idea and making connections between texts. They will aim to recognise the difference between fact and opinion, compare and contrast texts and identify the link between cause and effect in a written passage. For Writing, the students will cover the genres of Persuasive Texts, Information Reports and Newspaper Articles in lessons that involve the Six Traits of writing. They will work on using adverbs, adjectives, adverbial phrases and nouns and pronouns to create interesting and well-structured tasks with independence.

Science Focus:

Year 3: Chemical Science with a focus on solids, liquids and gasses, states of matter.

Year 4: Physical science with a focus on understanding the nature of forces and motion, and matter and energy.

Art Focus:

Year 3 and 4 students will be creating a mixed media collage inspired by the artist Elizabeth St Hilaire Nelson. They will also experiment with different printing techniques.



Music Focus:

In Term 2, the Year 3 and Year 4 students will use the recorder to continue developing their understanding of musical elements. Formal notation will be introduced and they will have the opportunity to practise and perform a variety of songs that utilise a range of notes and musical styles.

Sport Focus:

During Term 2, students will refine their catching, throwing, kicking, attacking and defending skills through participation in modified invasion sports such as netball, basketball and soccer. The Nunawading District Cross Country will be held on Thursday 1st May at Ruffey Lake

Digitech:

In Term 2, Grade 3 students will be exploring a range of digital and STEM-focused learning experiences. They will use Canva to create engaging posters that showcase their class inquiry unit, developing their design skills while communicating their learning effectively. As part of their Cyber Safety lessons, students will learn how to stay safe and responsible online, building awareness of privacy, security, and digital etiquette. Additionally, they will engage in design thinking STEM projects, where they will apply creativity and problem-solving to hands-on challenges, fostering innovation and critical thinking.

Year 4 students will be developing their coding skills by creating interactive quizzes in Scratch, using if statements, variables, and text-to-voice to enhance engagement. They will also begin their Term 3 design thinking work with Tinkercad, learning the basics of 3D design through hands-on projects. Additionally, students will explore aspects of digital citizenship, focusing on being respectful and responsible online.

Indonesian

During Term 2, students will be introduced to vocabulary relating to their emotions, to build a greater word bank to draw on when responding to 'Apa kabar?' (How are you?). They will continue to build on their knowledge of verbs. Students will have the opportunity to learn about Wayang Kulit, the traditional form of shadow puppetry.



Year 5 and Year 6

Literacy Focus:

The Year 6 students will be reading 'Scar Town' by
Tristan Bancks. The book takes readers on a
thrilling adventure through the perspective of children
exploring an abandoned town. It incorporates themes of
honesty, truth and friendship.

The Year 5 students will be reading The Night Bus Hero by Onjali Q Raud. The text outlines some of the struggles that homeless people have, and lots of work around comprehension and the main ideas is done. The text links in with the Inquiry Unit, as students choose a charity to support with the profit from their Market Day sales. There will be a continued focus on using evidence from the text to aid comprehension, and utilising reading strategies when participating in Literary Circle sessions. For Writing, Year 5 students will explore a variety of genres while focusing on developing their skills in the 6+1 writing traits.

Data Investigation



Art Focus:

Year 5 and 6 students will be focusing on collage and create artworks inspired by artists Elizabeth St Hilaire Nelson and Pete Cromer.



They will make their own textured paper and also use a grid method to draw from an enlarged sketch from a photograph.

Music Focus:

In Term 2, the Year 5 and Year 6 students will use the ukulele to continue developing their understanding of musical elements. Pitch, form and rhythm will also be explored as the Year 5's create and perform a jingle for their Market Day product, and the Year 6's create and perform a song about a season.

Sport Focus:

During Term 2, students will extend their decision-making skills through participation in invasion sports such as netball, basketball and soccer. The Nunawading District Interschool Winter Sport Carnival for all Year 5 and 6 students will be held on Friday 13th June and Friday 27th June.

Digitech

In Term 2, Year 5 and 6 students will dive into design thinking as they explore problem-solving in different ways. Year 5 will work within a structured framework, learning about the design thinking methodology and using Canva to present solutions, considering how different approaches suit different needs. Meanwhile, Year 6 will take a more self-directed approach, applying the design cycle to tackle problems based on their own interests. With a strong focus on student agency and voice, they will choose a program or platform that best suits their passions—whether it's Canva, Scratch, Tinkercad, or another tool—to bring their ideas to life in a meaningful way.

Science Focus:

This term the students will be exploring the Physical Sciences. The Year 5 Students will focus on how light can form shadows and be absorbed, reflected and refracted. The Year 6 students will focus on electricity and electrical circuits.

Indonesian

During Term 2, students will build on their knowledge of adjectives to describe characteristics of people and of products. They will develop strategies to aid in recall and memorisation, to deepen their personal word banks. Students will have the opportunity to learn about Wayang Kulit, the traditional form of shadow puppetry.
